## Introduction

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## Acceptable Use Policy

With the increase in cyber threats and issues around data loss NHSGGC has a new suite of security policies and approach to managing Information Security - the Acceptable Use Policy covers the do's and don'ts for all NHSGGC users when on our system or network.

All NHSGGC staff should read and comply with the new [Acceptable Use Policy](#) which can be found under [Information Governance and Information Technology Security Framework](#) on StaffNet.

From 14 January 2019, the acceptable use policy will be delivered to all users in four parts using on-screen pop-ups, for users to read and accept the policy as well as answer three simple questions with each part to test their understanding of the policy.

It is expected that each part will take about five minutes to complete and while there are options to defer, it will need to be read and accepted within four weeks.

Work is due to start within days on two new £11 million acute mental health wards at Stobhill Hospital.
